
Let's Draw Lines

To Parents: This activity focuses on drawing a straight line that changes direction. This can be difficult. Encourage your child to work slowly and to pause at each corner before making the sharp turn.

Let's Draw a Bow

To Parents: This activity is designed to teach shape recognition. Guide your child to draw the shape in one stroke, which helps to build handwriting skills.

To Parents: In this maze, one path leads to the garden and one path leads to a dead end. It is important for your child to stop and look at each path option before deciding which way to go.





Let's help Rabbit water the flowers. Draw a line from \longrightarrow to \longrightarrow .



Let's Color the Penguins

To Parents: By two years old, your child will likely understand the numbers one to three. By three or four years old, he or she will likely understand the numbers one through ten.





Trace the number with your finger. Then, color the penguin's nose and feet orange.
